





Figure 1. On-Region Characteristics




Figure 2. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 3. On-Resistance Variation vs. Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Figure 4. Body Diode Forward Voltage Variation vs. Source Current and Temperature




Figure 5. Capacitance Characteristics






Figure 6. Gate Charge Characteristics




**Figure 7. Breakdown Voltage Variation vs. Temperature**




**Figure 8. On-Resistance Variation vs. Temperature**

**Figure 11. Transient Thermal Response Curve**




Figure 12. Gate Charge Test Circuit & Waveform




Figure 13. Resistive Switching Test Circuit & Waveforms




Figure 14. Unclamped Inductive Switching Test Circuit & Waveforms





Figure 15. Peak Diode Recovery  $dv/dt$  Test Circuit & Waveforms
