

Fig 1. Total power dissipation as a function of average on-state current; maximum values.





Fig 2. Non-repetitive peak on-state current as a function of the number of sinusoidal current cycles; maximum values.





**Fig 4. RMS on-state current as a function of surge duration for sinusoidal currents.**




**Fig 5. RMS on-state current as a function of lead temperature; maximum values.**




Fig 7. Normalized gate trigger voltage as a function of junction temperature.





Fig 8. Normalized gate trigger current as a function junction temperature.





Fig 9. On-state current characteristics.





**Fig 12. Critical rate of rise of off-state voltage as a function of junction temperature; typical values.**


