

Fig. 2: Average forward current versus ambient temperature ($\delta = 0.5$).




Fig. 3: Normalized avalanche power derating versus pulse duration.




Fig. 4: Normalized avalanche power derating versus junction temperature.





Fig. 5: Non repetitive surge peak forward current versus overload duration (maximum values).




Fig. 7: Reverse leakage current versus reverse voltage applied (typical values).




Fig. 9: Forward voltage drop versus forward current.




Fig. 6: Relative variation of thermal impedance junction to case versus pulse duration.




Fig. 8: Junction capacitance versus reverse voltage applied (typical values).






Fig. 10: Thermal resistance junction to ambient versus copper surface under tab (epoxy printed board FR4, $\text{Cu} = 35\mu\text{m}$).






